There's one public hearing today to be presented by Rachel Lenberger. Good afternoon, Supervisor and Members of the Board. The purpose of today's public hearing is to consider the adoption of a new article of Chapter 215 as it relates to emergency scene solicitation and board up services. The purpose of this article is to regulate solicitation at emergency scenes within the town, while recognizing the licensing authority exercised by Suffolk County over board up businesses and similar contractors. The restrictions contained in this article are directly solely at commercial solicitation practices occurring at emergency scenes, and are necessary to protect public safety and prevent interference with emergency operations. The proposed amendments establish restrictions on conduct at emergency scenes, including prohibiting the unauthorized following of emergency vehicles, misrepresentation of affiliation with emergency agencies, and refusal to comply with lawful orders to leave an emergency scene. Violations of this article would be enforceable by the Town Fire Marshal, the Suffolk County Police Department, Town Code Enforcement Officers, or any other authorized officers with penalties up to \$1,000 fine or imprisonment not exceeding 15 days. Chapter TC7. Off-Road Vehicles**

§TC7-1. Definitions.

BICYCLE WITH ELECTRIC ASSIST; ELECTRIC BICYCLE; E-BIKE

Shall have the meaning set forth in New York Vehicle and Traffic Law §102-c, including Class 1, Class 2, and Class 3 e-bikes.

MOTORIZED DEVICE

Means any motor-assisted scooter, mini-bike, dirt bike, moped, all-terrain vehicle, or similar powered device, whether or not required to be registered under New York State law, but not including devices defined as an OFF-ROAD VEHICLE in this chapter or mobility devices and adaptive mobility devices used by persons with disabilities, including wheelchairs, electric mobility aids, adaptive electric bicycles or tricycles specifically configured or used to assist mobility, and other mobility-assistance devices permitted under applicable federal or state law.

§TC7-2. Operation restricted.

D. Electric bicycles and motorized devices on public property.

1. Except as expressly authorized by resolution of the Town Board, no person shall operate a bicycle with electric assist or motorized device upon any Town-owned or Town-controlled property, whether paved or unpaved, including but not limited to nature preserves, trails, playgrounds, athletic fields, or other Town lands, except on a public highway, as defined in the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law.
2. No person shall operate a bicycle with electric assist or motorized device upon any Town-owned or Town-controlled roadway with a posted speed limit in excess of thirty (30) miles per hour, unless expressly authorized by resolution of the Town Board.
3. Operation within Town parks, beaches, and recreational facilities shall be governed by §101-7(C) of the Code of the Town of Smithtown.
4. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit operation of a bicycle with electric assist in areas where such use is expressly permitted and regulated pursuant to §101-7(C), and nothing herein shall limit enforcement of violations pursuant to Chapter 101 of this Code.

§TC7-4. Impoundment.

B. Upon making an arrest or issuing a summons or an appearance ticket for a violation of §TC7-2A, B, ~~or C~~, or D, or upon lawful removal of a device pursuant to §101-7(C), or in the event a police or peace officer has probable cause to believe a person has committed a violation of §TC7-2A, B, ~~or C~~, or D and has fled the scene leaving the ORV, motorized device, or bicycle with electric assist behind, a police or peace officer may seize such ORV, motorized device, or bicycle with electric assist. The impounded ORV, motorized device, or bicycle with electric assist shall be stored by the Town of Smithtown or other enforcement agency, pending the identification of the owner as registered with the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles, or, in the case of motorized devices or bicycles with electric assist, upon proof of ownership satisfactory to the Town or other enforcement, and payment of the redemption fee provided in this section, together with reasonable and customary towing, maintenance, and daily storage fees as established by the Director of Public Safety. Such owner shall be sent notice of such impoundment to the address on file with the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles by certified mail within five days of impoundment. The Town of Smithtown shall not be liable for any damages arising out of the provision of an erroneous name or address of such owner.

F. Redemption fee for bicycles with electric assist. The redemption fee for a bicycle with electric assist impounded for a violation of §TC7-2D shall be \$250 for a first violation and \$500 for a second violation within five (5) years, in addition to reasonable and customary towing, maintenance, and daily storage fees as may be established by the Director of Public Safety.

G. Redemption fee for motorized devices. The redemption fee for a motorized device impounded for a violation of §TC7-2D shall be \$500 for a first violation and \$1000 for a second violation within five (5) years, in addition to reasonable and customary towing, maintenance, and daily storage fees as may be established by the Director of Public Safety.

H. Parental responsibility. The parent or legal guardian of any person under the age of eighteen (18) who violates §TC7-2D or §101-7(C) shall be responsible for payment of any fine, fee, or charge imposed pursuant to this chapter.

Chapter 101 – Department of Parks, Buildings and Grounds

§101-7 Bicycles; overflights; electric bicycles and motorized devices.

C. Electric bicycles and motorized devices.

(1) Definitions.

(a) Bicycle with electric assist, electric bicycle, or e-bike shall have the meaning set forth in New York Vehicle and Traffic Law §102-c, including Class 1, Class 2, and Class 3 e-bikes.

(b) Motorized device means any motor-assisted scooter, mini-bike, dirt bike, moped, all-terrain vehicle, or similar powered device, whether or not required to be registered under State law, excluding off-road vehicles as defined in Chapter TC7 and mobility devices used by persons with disabilities as permitted under federal or state law.

(2) Prohibited operation. Except as provided in Subsection C(3), no person shall operate an electric bicycle or motorized device within any Town park, beach, trail, or recreational facility. Operation on paved park roads open to the public or within parking areas is prohibited unless specifically authorized by resolution of the Town Board. No person shall operate an electric bicycle or motorized device upon any pedestrian walkway, path, or trail not expressly designated for such use.

(3) Conditional operation in designated areas. Where the Town Board has expressly authorized operation of electric bicycles in designated areas, the following shall apply:

(a) Helmet requirement. All operators and passengers shall wear a properly fitted and fastened helmet meeting the requirements of New York Vehicle and Traffic Law §1238.

(b) Age restriction. No person under the age of sixteen (16) years shall operate an electric bicycle within Town park property.

(c) Area limitation. Operation shall be limited to areas designated for vehicular or bicycle travel and shall not occur in areas primarily intended for pedestrian use unless specifically posted.

(d) Due care. Operation shall be conducted with due care for the safety of pedestrians and other users of Town property.

(4) Exceptions. This section shall not apply to:

(a) Mobility devices and adaptive mobility devices used by persons with disabilities, including wheelchairs, electric mobility aids, adaptive electric bicycles or tricycles specifically configured or used to assist mobility, and other mobility-assistance devices permitted under applicable federal or state law. Such exception shall also apply to aides or companions accompanying a person utilizing such a device where reasonably necessary to provide assistance or support;

(b) Town/emergency use, including authorized Town vehicles and equipment, law enforcement, fire, and ambulance services;

(c) Designated areas or events posted or permitted by the Town Parks Maintenance Director.

(5) Penalties; removal.

A violation of this Subsection C shall be punishable as provided in §101-29. In addition, violators may be directed by the Department of Public Safety to leave park property immediately. Any electric bicycle or motorized device operated in violation of this subsection may be removed from Town property by the Department of Public Safety or other authorized personnel and secured in a designated or appropriate location for safekeeping. Such device shall be released to the owner or operator upon proof of ownership or lawful possession. Nothing herein shall limit enforcement of violations pursuant to Chapter TC7 of the Code of the Town of Smithtown. Any such removal may result in impoundment pursuant to Chapter TC7.

Upon expiration of the initial moratorium period and an initial extension period, the Town requires an additional extension of the moratorium for an additional six (6) months to thoroughly vet and consider the recommendations and changes proposed by the Inter-Agency Fire Safety Working Group, New York State's proposed updates to the fire safety code in relation to Battery Energy Storage Systems, and the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) Battery Energy Storage System Guidebook. An extension of the moratorium is necessary to complete the legislative intent set forth when the Town Board initially adopted the moratorium on September 19, 2024 and extended said moratorium on August 12, 2025.
